From Pastor Howard...

Sisters and brothers,

Something you haven't seen here since November: five things that are good for a congregation to do during a time of transition:

- To come to terms with its past
- To encourage new leadership to emerge
- To reconsider its identity
- To improve its relationship with the wider Church
- To prepare to welcome its next called pastor

We look at the third of them this month: "To reconsider its identity."

Someone coming into our building from the East or the West parking lot door would have a hard time missing a bulletin board on the wall of the narthex. It's the one that's usually behind a table of treats on Sunday mornings, and right now is behind a large mass of gifts we'll be giving to needy families in our neighborhood. (Those are both pretty good clues to our identity, too.) In letters almost half a foot high, it says "Saved by the Grace of God to Witness and to Serve Others."

It is what we say we are. It is what we say we are for. God, seeing value in us, has pulled us away from uselessness, and has taught us to see value in our neighbors, and to minister to their needs, spiritual and relational and physical.

I wasn't here when that Mission Statement was adopted, but I'm guessing that it emerged from a great deal of serious thought and serious discussion. Maybe something like, "We used to think we were okay because we're basically pretty good people. And we used to think we were here to make life better for ourselves. Now we know better."

Listening to conversations here, some ideas about our Mission Statement have caught my ear. One is that it's pretty old. Another is that our current Mission Statement, as good as it is, doesn't say anything about our need for spiritual growth, our need to be moving "to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ," as the author of the letter to the Ephesians puts it. Another is the question, "What does it mean to be a welcoming church?" Or, put another way, "We want to be a welcoming church, but how welcoming do we want to be? And, to whom?"

More than one person has suggested that it might be time for us to think about, and maybe adopt, a new Mission Statement. I agree. I think it might be good for us to say, "As we leave 2024 behind and enter 2025, this is who we are, and this is what we think God has in mind for us."

What do you think?

We begin January with a new year full of exciting opportunities to continue to carry out God's mission in our communities, congregation, and individual lives. Please continue to keep the council and the whole congregation of St. John's in your prayers as we continue to carry out God's mission in the world.


Christy Schramm...Once again you did an AMAZING job in organizing our families for the angel tree! You have a gift of service to others and we appreciate you so much. Thank you!




