Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The start of September brings about the resumption of the Sunday School season, which kicks off with Rally Day on Sunday, Sept.7. We give a special thanks to all our volunteer Sunday School and

Catechism teachers who make such an impact on our people through our Christian educational programing. Also included in this are our adult Sunday School classes and Bible studies as well. Additionally, we will be holding our second Rise Against Hunger event on this same day at 2:00 PM. During this event, we will assemble and pack several thousand meal kits for people in need throughout the world. This event coincides with the ELCA's God's Work, Our Hands weekend of service projects. I invite everyone to set aside time as you are able to come and participate in this event as we work to fulfill the needs of those throughout the world who have less, just as Jesus instructs us to do.

Taking a brief look back, a special congregational meeting was held on Sunday, Aug. 17, during which the congregation voted to approve projects to replace the asphalt parking lots on the church campus and to install an air conditioning system for the narthex and several Dayschool classrooms. Thank you to everyone who participated in the meeting. Further details on the specific timing of both projects will be shared in the future as soon as they are identified. All of the funds for both projects will be taken from the Improvement Fund.

Two very important components of reorganization within the congregation are ongoing as well. The congregational council has taken the first steps to begin forming the call committee to begin the process of searching for our next called pastor. As we move forward with the formation of the committee, we ask all those who may be approached to consider serving on the committee to take the time to prayerfully consider the call to serve. Furthermore, the reorganization efforts of the Dayschool continue as well. The interim Dayschool board continues to actively search for a new full-time administrator. Any inquiries or recommendations for this position can be directed to any member of the interim board (composed of Pastor Cindy, Pastor Howard, Kristy Williams, Sandy Orth, Shirley Johnson, and Kyle Henry). Shirley Johnson has agreed to serve as the Dayschool treasurer for the next year, and we express our sincere thanks for her ongoing service and dedication to the Dayschool and congregation as a whole. As has been mentioned many times before, the Dayshool is a very important part of the ministry of St. John's, and we are focused on ensuring that it is best positioned to continue to grow and fulfill its important work in our community.




