From Pastor Howard...

As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share... (Emphasis mine.)

~ 1 Timothy 6:17-18

In our daily reading, Sarah and I encounter that passage every October 26. On September 28, it was part of the Second Reading for our morning worship service. Every time I see it, I wonder, "What's going on here?"

The author of 1 Timothy sounds to me a lot different from the way Jesus sounds. When Jesus gives us instructions, he tells us what to do. He doesn't tell us what to be ready to do. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." Did Jesus ever tell us to be ready to share? If there's a record of his having said that, I haven't stumbled over it. More than once, though, Jesus says "Share."

So why the softening in 1 Timothy? I do not know. I think I do know, though, that readiness doesn't amount to much if it doesn't lead to action.

If I'm ready to worship every Sunday, but when the alarm goes off, I decide to sleep in this week, it's not going to help my faith grow.

Same if I'm ready to commit myself to daily prayer, but never decide what part of my normal routine to drop, or shorten, so I have time to pray.

And if I'm ready, finally, to take the Bible seriously, and devote significant time and effort to reading and studying it? I'm ready! Um, first though, I want to finish the John Sandford novel I'm reading, and maybe the new Michael Connelly whodunit that just got published. Oh, and the library book group is going to be discussing *Huckleberry Finn*, which I haven't read for decades. And there's the Jonathan Haidt a friend recommended. But the Bible is definitely on my "To Read" list.

How about if I'm ready for a closer relationship with another disciple of Jesus, for "what Luther referred to as 'conversation and consolation'" for mutual encouragement, and reflection, and prayer, but the right person keeps not showing up? Will my readiness help my faith in Christ to strengthen?

I'm ready to tithe, of course, as soon as I can afford it.

And I'm ready to be involved in the work of the kingdom of God, doing works of mercy, and working for justice for the poor and the oppressed. But how?

I typed this in a cabin in the woods in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. Across the room was my brother's chainsaw. I'm pretty sure it's ready to go. Tim keeps it tuned up, teeth on the chain sharpened. Until he comes back next year, though, its readiness is going to count for exactly nothing. (When I go after firewood, I use a bow saw. It's quieter, it doesn't pump out smelly carcinogens, and I think it's healthier to burn carbohydrates than hydrocarbons.) The readiness of the chainsaw to cut wood might be a lot like a rich person's readiness to share: the cutting, the sharing, might not happen much.

With all due respect to the author of 1 Timothy, I'd say you will be a lot more helpful to your neighbor if, instead of worrying about how ready you are to share, you just share.

What do you think?






